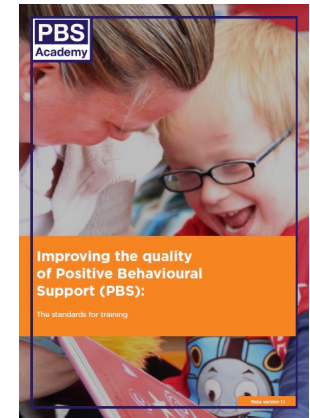
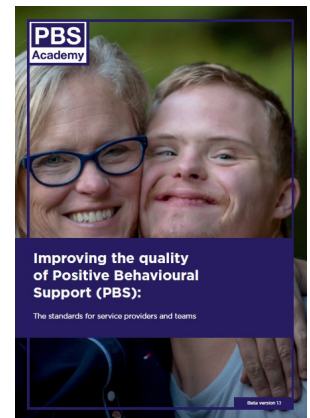


Developing PBS Training for Commissioners: A Co-Production Event

What's the event about?

- Commissioning is the starting point for designing and delivering high quality services for people with learning disabilities at risk of presenting behaviours that challenges.
- The role of commissioners for all age groups across health and social care is therefore pivotal in helping people and their families have good lives.
- Commissioners are an essential part of the workforce responsible for delivering positive behavioural support (PBS) and need to be equipped to inform, shape and evaluate services that support people and their families.
- We are designing PBS training for commissioners and their teams. To do this effectively we want to understand what commissioners already know about PBS.
- We are running 3 half-day workshops for commissioners to begin the process of co-designing the training.
- The face-to-face sessions will be interactive to help us understand what you already know about PBS and to find out what additional knowledge you think would be useful in your role.
- Once this information has been collected, we will use it to design PBS training for commissioners.
- We plan to start delivering the training in 2024.
