RADF Coding Requirements

To enable national sharing of the RADF a number of coded entries need to be present on a patient's record, the Cumbria PRIMIS resources support these coding requirements.

Introduction	<p>Under the Equality Act 2010, organisations have a legal duty to ensure that services are as accessible to people with disabilities as they are for everybody else. For example: longer appointments; easy read materials; interpreter; communications via a carer (e.g. when they are referred or present for care). These are Reasonable Adjustments.</p> <p>The Reasonable Adjustment Digital Flag (RADF) will enable the sharing of a patient's individual needs using the NHS Spine's National Care Record Service (NCRS), indicating that Reasonable Adjustments are required. When the RADF is shared with other relevant care settings, it will inform the service ahead about a person's need for adjustment(s).</p> <p>Recording and flagging Reasonable Adjustments accurately will allow them to be shared so that they can be recognised and met as required.</p> <p>This template facilitates the capture of coded data for the RADF, as defined in the national dataset of the Information Standard.</p>
Reasonable Adjustments	RADF Eligibility
Version & Disclaimers	<p>The Equality Act (2010) definition of disability is "A physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long-term negative effect on ability to do normal daily activities" for a year or more.</p> <p>A diagnosis is not needed for Reasonable Adjustments to be recorded and / or shared.</p>

	<p>To enable the national sharing of the RADF, a number of coded entries need to be present on a patient's record:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">* FLAG* CONSENT* TYPE of Reasonable Adjustment(s) required <p>These are clearly labelled in this template to aid data entry.</p> <p><i>Note: FLAG and CONSENT <u>must</u> be recorded, otherwise the TYPE of Reasonable Adjustment required will not be uploaded and available nationally via the Spine.</i></p>

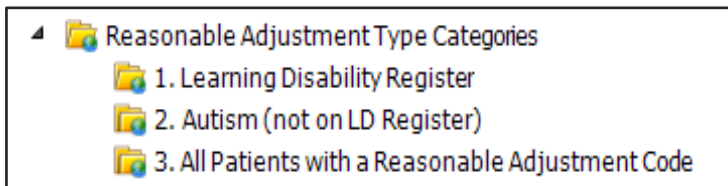
- Learning Disability Register
 - 1. RADF Flag Code Recorded
 - 1.1 RADF Flag Code Recorded - No Consent for Upload to NCRS
 - 1.2 RADF Flag Code Recorded - With Consent for Upload to NCRS

3. A patient with or without a diagnosis recorded, may have a 'Type' code, e.g. 'Communications Support' but no 'Flag' or 'Consent' for upload recorded.

'It must be remembered that identification of an underlying cause or diagnosis is not necessary to determine if a person meets the criteria of disability under the Equality Act (2010).'

Reasonable Adjustment Type Categories:

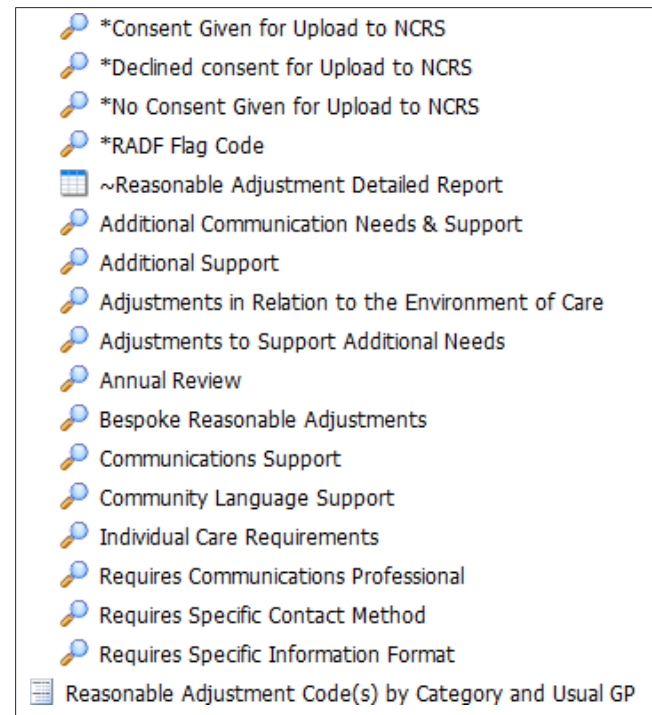


~Reasonable Adjustments Detailed Report

Patient List Report providing a detailed view of **all** Reasonable Adjustment codes where a patient has at least one recorded. Including: LD, Autism, RADF Flag, Consent, Type (by category); and last review date.

Reasonable Adjustment Code(s) by Category and Usual GP

Audit Report summarising the practice’s Reasonable Adjustment coding, using the same criteria as above.
